WHY THE LATINO COMMUNITY IS CRUCIAL TO OUR FUTURE

THE FACE OF BOSTON IS CHANGING. Today, more than 20 percent of our city's population is Latino. In fact, without Latinos, Boston would still be at 1980 population levels. The Latino community is also keeping Boston young: Close to one-third of Boston's children are Latino—and as Latino families drive population growth, they are making vital contributions to our culture and our economy. Latinos make up 14 percent of our workforce.

THE LATINO LEGACY FUND at the Boston Foundation, the only Latino-focused fund in Greater Boston, was established in 2013 to contribute to our region's civic vitality by supporting nonprofits that advance the socioeconomic status of Latinos, while building and enhancing Latino leadership.

IMPACT

In just five years, the Latino Legacy Fund has raised more than \$1 million and made over \$300,000 in grants to Latino-serving nonprofits in the areas of early childhood, education, ESOL and workforce development.
